Who does **Pentecostal mean?**

**Pentecost literally means “50”
and was the Jewish feast of weeks (Shavuot)
celebrated 50 days after Passover.**

**The Holy Spirit was first poured out
upon the disciples at Pentecost.**

What was the point of Pentecost?

Power.

- 1. The power to make a difference. [Luke 24:49](#)**
- 2. The power to live righteously. [Gal. 5:16](#)**
- 3. The power to live supernaturally. [1 Cor. 2:4-5](#)**

If you believe the power of the Holy Spirit is still available today, you're Pentecostal.

Who does **Charismatic** mean?

From the Greek word *charisma*
meaning “grace gift”

The Holy Spirit gives spiritual gifts –
supernatural abilities empowering
believers to minister to others.

1 Corinthians 12:4-7

How should we interact with spiritual gifts?

- 1. Desire spiritual gifts. 1 Cor. 14:1**
- 2. Develop your spiritual gifts. 2 Tim. 1:6**
- 3. Use your spiritual gifts. 1 Peter 4:10**

If you believe the gifts of the Spirit are still empowering people today, you're Charismatic.

Test the fruit.
