Who is Gen Z?

- Ages 7-22
- First phone was a smart phone received between ages 10-12
- 91 percent of Generation Z have their digital devices in bed in the evening.
- 32 percent of Generation Z would rather go three days without a shower than go a week without their phone.
- 92 percent of Generation Z college students have access to Netflix and 38 percent of Generation Z consume daily video via Netflix.
- A quarter of Generation Z say that Snapchat is "essential for their relationships."
- 3+ hours of screen time per day

What Apps Do They Use?

- SnapChat: App that allows users to send images/text that disappear after viewing. Uses filters
- Instagram: App that allows users to post images/video using filters with ability to "like" images
- Youtube: Video streaming site. Mainly used for How to's/ Game streaming
- TikTok: Video app that allows users to post short videos using filters and background music

How Does Affect their Relationship with God?

Internet Culture is shaping Gen Z more than Kingdom Culture

Internet Culture


- Values are shaped by what gets more "likes" than by what is true and life giving (Phillippians 4:8)
- Internet Culture values trends so Christianity becomes a trend and not a lifestyle (Matthew 13:15)
- Students give in to things that are culturally acceptable but are harmful spiritually (1 Corinthians 10:23) (Judges 13-16)
- Students spend more time communing with people via the internet than they do communing with God

How Does this Affect Their Relationship With God?

Endless distraction has caused God to be left on "read"

Left On Read

- 40% of Gen Z say they use multiple devices at the same time
- Only 39% of Gen Z believes spirituality is important
- Biblical literacy amongst Gen Z is lower than any other Generation
- By giving in to the distractions Gen Z has left God on Read



How Does this Affect Their Relationship With God?

Indoctrination

Indoctrination

- Students are learning about taboo subjects from internet personalities instead of parents/pastors
- Faith is tested before a proper foundation can even be established
- Bad teaching overtime causes shaky faiths to crumble
- False teachers (2 Timothy 4: 3-4)

What Can We Do?

Be Involved

- Know what sites/apps your student uses
- Communicate with them where they are at
- Have conversations and model the wholesome use of the platform

What Can We Do?

Set Boundaries

- Boundaries keep us safe from things that may harm us and teach healthy habits
- Set limits for the amount of time spent on Social Media/Streaming
- Know who they are talking to
- Have times during the week when no one uses the internet
